
DEAR ORCHESTRA FAMILIES AND SUPPORTERS,

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Jason AielloDirector of Orchestras

Jason Aiello began teaching orchestra at Santa Monica High School in 2006, after graduating with honors from UCLA as the recipient of the Joyce Fahlman Fellowship. While at UCLA, he studied music education with Dr. Frank Heuser and cello with Antonio Lysy.

In addition to his work at Santa Monica High School, Mr. Aiello teaches cello sectionals and conducts the Sinfonia Orchestra for Elemental Strings, a youth orchestra program for elementary school students in Santa Monica. In past summers, Mr. Aiello has served as the Senior Camp Orchestra Director at the La Honda Music Camp in Northern California.

As a guest conductor, Jason has worked with honor orchestras sponsored by CMEA (California Music Educators Association) and SCSBOA (Southern California School Band and Orchestra Association). Currently, he serves on the board of the California Orchestra Directors Association, where his primary responsibilities have included creating and maintaining the CODA website and auditioning junior high and high school cellists for various CODA sponsored honor orchestras.



Emily TaylorDirector of Orchestras

Emily Taylor, a proud alumna of Santa Monica High School, graduated from UCLA with a degree in Music Education, where she studied violin with Margaret Lysy and pedagogy with Dr. Johanna Gamboa-Kroesen. She has taught strings and general music across elementary to high school levels throughout LAUSD, Manhattan Beach Unified, and Santa Monica, including work with

Elemental Music, SOL-LA Music Academy, and Saint Anne School.

Her experience includes leading ensembles, coaching sectionals, teaching private lessons, and developing inclusive, studentcentered curriculum. As a Gluck Fellow at UCLA, she also brought chamber music outreach performances to diverse communities across Los Angeles.

Ms. Taylor has presented at the California All-State Music Education Conference and contributed research on belonging and cultural identity in school music programs. She is passionate about fostering technical excellence, expressive musicianship, and a lifelong love of music in her students.

Ryan Baird, Bass Coach

Dr. Ryan Baird earned his DMA in Double Bass Performance from the University of Southern California, studying with David Allen Moore. He regularly performs with Delirium Musicum, the Santa Barbara Symphony, and serves as Principal Bass of the Downey Symphony. A strong advocate for contemporary music, Ryan is

also Principal Bass of the Cabrillo Festival in Santa Cruz each August. He performs with orchestras across Southern California, including the Pasadena Symphony, Long Beach Symphony, Santa Barbara Opera, and Musica Angelica Baroque Orchestra. In addition to performing, Ryan teaches private lessons and directs the Bass Ensemble at the Colburn Community School for the Performing Arts. Each summer, he also teaches at the Idyllwild Arts music programs for pre-college musicians. Outside of music, Ryan enjoys running in the mountains..



Finn Bordal, Violin Coach

Santa Monica native, violinist Finn Bordal teaches strings at the SMMUSD schools he attended as a student, coaches ensembles through local nonprofit Elemental Music, and maintains a private studio of students. Finn performs regularly with Passacaglia and with the Westside Chamber Orchestra, and gigs locally in other capacities. In his spare time, you'll probably find Finn at a local climbing gym, or better yet, climbing

outdoors on the lovely rocks that Southern California has to offer!



Josephine Moerschel, Viola Coach

Dr. Josephine ("Dr. Jo") is the Executive and Artistic Director of Elemental Music and directs the Elemental Strings Chamber Orchestra. She has served on the faculties of the Bob Cole Conservatory at CSU Long Beach and Long Beach City College and co-directed Junior Chamber Music Los Angeles and ViolaFest LA. She has also sat on the boards of the Southern California Viola

Society and ASTA's Greater LA branch. As a violist, Josephine performs with the New West Symphony and has played with the LA Philharmonic, LA Opera, Pacific Symphony, and more. A sought-after teacher, she has maintained a violin and viola studio on the westside for 20 years and worked extensively with Santa Monica-Malibu schools. Her students have performed in top youth orchestras, conservatories, and festivals. Josephine earned a DMA in viola performance from the University of Texas at Austin, studying with Roger Myers, Donald McInnes, Masao Kawasaki, and Catharine Carroll.



Reiko Nakano, Violin Coach

Reiko Nakano is a violinist, educator, and co-owner of Sound Roads Music in Santa Monica. She earned her Bachelor of Music degree from Berklee College of Music, specializing in Jazz and World Music, while also developing as a classically trained violinist. Known for her versatility, Reiko has performed with acclaimed artists and contributed to projects including the Grammy-nominated soundtrack for

Becoming by Kamasi Washington and GNX by Kendrick Lamar. Alongside her performance career, Reiko is passionate about teaching. With years of experience, she brings creativity, discipline, and inspiration to her lessons, encouraging students to explore styles they enjoy. Believing every student is an artist, she tailors her approach to build both confidence and technical skill, inspiring the next generation to connect with their passion for music.



Christopher Parise, Percussion Coach

Christopher Parise is a freelance percussionist and clinician based in Los Angeles. Graduating from UCLA's Herb Alpert School of Music in 2010 with a B.A in percussion performance, Chris's versatility as a musician has led him to tour throughout the United States with a variety of artists including Grammynominated baritone Jubilant Sykes, Harriet

Brown, Rare Times, Liphemra, Total Blue, The Mark Allen Group, and south Florida rapper Denzel Curry.

Besides teaching out of his private studio his own studio, Chris serves as a percussion coach at John Adams Middle School, Lincoln Middle School, and Santa Monica High School and is a certified Social Emotional Arts Facilitator for LAUSD and SMMUSD.



Layla Shapouri, Viola Coach

Layla Shapouri graduated from the UCLA Herb Alpert School of Music in June 2025 with a degree in viola performance. Her musical journey began sixteen years ago with piano and music theory, later expanding to viola, voice, and teaching. Layla has taught private students in viola, cello, and piano, and has worked closely with young orchestra musicians.

She has performed in numerous solo and chamber recitals and participated in masterclasses with Carla Rodrigues, Yizhak Schotten, Iman Khosrowpour, and Blaise Magniere. Her orchestral and ensemble experiences include performances across the United States, Argentina, and Uruguay. While her main focus has been chamber and solo performance, Layla has also pursued pre-medical studies and tutored STEM students. She currently works as a viola sectionals coach at Santa Monica High School (SAMOHI) and at a residential mental health facility, combining her passions for music, teaching, and service.



Eric Shetzen, Bass Coach

Double bassist Eric Shetzen maintains a multi-faceted career as a performer, teacher, and recording artist. He received both his Bachelor and Master of Music degrees at the Juilliard School in New York City and for three years served as Principal Bass of the Hyogo Performing Arts Center Orchestra in Osaka, Japan. He also spent several seasons as a Fellow in the New World Symphony, America's Orchestral Academy directed by Michael Tilson

Thomas. When Eric is not performing on stage in various SoCal orchestras and chamber music groups, he can be found teaching his studio of private bass students or recording the music of Hollywood's most iconic composers for film and television.



Charlie Tyler, Cello Coach

Cellist Charlie Tyler has built a dynamic career as a soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral performer. He won the Cleveland Institute of Music's Concerto Competition, the Osaka International Music Competition, and the Atwater Kent Strings Competition. As co-principal cello of Japan's Hyogo Performing Arts Center Orchestra for three seasons, he also

performed in chamber and solo recitals. Charlie has appeared at the Tanglewood Music Center, Castleton Festival, and as principal cellist of the National Repertory Orchestra. In Southern California, he performs regularly with leading orchestras and in series such as Jacaranda, Dilijan, Hear/Now, and Salastina. Each winter, he plays with the Arizona MusicFest Orchestra in Scottsdale. In addition to live performances, Charlie maintains an active recording career in Los Angeles, contributing to numerous film and television scores.



Laila Zakzook, Viola Coach

A passionate chamber musician, violist Laila Zakzook won the 2014 Lillian Fuchs Chamber Music Competition and the Colburn School's Honors Quartet Scholarship. Dedicated to new music, she premiered Caroline Shaw's In Manus Tuas in Canada and performed Steve Reich's Duet with Mika and Richard Stoltzman at Carnegie Hall. Laila has held principal and assistant principal positions under conductors like Leonard

Slatkin and Philippe Entremont in ensembles including the Banff Festival Orchestra and The Royal Conservatory Orchestra. She also performed and recorded Sumeida's Song by Mohammed Fairouz at Carnegie Hall. She has participated in festivals such as Banff, Rockport, Heifetz, and Music by the Sea. A graduate of The Glenn Gould School, Manhattan School of Music, and Oberlin Conservatory, she has collaborated with the Grammy-winning Attacca Quartet and artists like Steven Dann and Osvaldo Golijov. A Santa Monica High alum, she is thrilled to work with young violists.

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Kicking off with tonight's Fall Benefit Concert, we are in for a year of great fun watching the students grow both musically, and as people. A big part of what makes this program so special is the community that is created when we all come together to witness and celebrate the passion and dedication of these students. Performing for you in this beautiful and historic theater is one of the most memorable parts of a student's Samohi experience.
